Important notes

SAFETY PROTOCOLS

- Face masks are mandatory whilst attending the event. Masks may be fabric or disposable and must cover the nose, mouth, and chin.
- To attend, proof of vaccination with both doses or the single dose against covid-19 must be presented, which can be digital (through ConecteSUS, Poupatempo Digital, or e-saúdeSP).
- Those who have had only one dose may attend upon presentation of a PCR test (no more than 48 hours old) or antigen test (no more than 24 hours old).

CONSUMPTION CARD

- This is the official means of purchase at the event and works like a prepaid card: just add credits and use them in the area, at the food stalls, and the Heritage Food area.
- Purchase your consumption card at fixed or mobile payment points which can be found throughout the event site.
- It costs R\$5 to activate the consumption card, deducted from the first credit made, and which can be refunded by returning the card, on the same day at the payment points located near the exit.
- The consumption card can be activated through cash or credit/debit card payment.
- The card activation fee is the only amount that will be refunded. To obtain the refund, the card must be returned to a fixed payment point. Any balance remaining on the card will not be refunded and, likewise, cannot be used on other days of the event.
- The consumption card activation is valid for one day only. That is, the card cannot be reused on other days of the event.
- All exhibitors have machines which only accept the consumption card. The only attractions at the event that work exclusively with cash or credit/debit cards are: the Arsenal da Esperança restaurant, the steam train ride, the Museum Cafeteria, and the Museum store.
- After each consumption transaction, a voucher will be printed with the order summary and the remaining balance.
- The organizers are not responsible for the use of the card, or if it is lost or stolen.

The 26th Immigrant Festival will have 50 food exhibitors offering typical traditional dishes and gastronomic reinterpretations, representing the following countries and regions: Armenia, Austria, Belgium, Bolivia, Bulgaria, Cameroon, Chile, China, Congo, Croatia, Egypt, Germany, India, Italy, Ivory Coast, Japan, Lithuania, Madeira Island, Mexico, Norway, Palestine, Peru, Portugal, Russia, South Korea, Syria, Turkey, and Venezuela.

Heritage Food

This area brings together exhibitors of handicraft products that can be taken away, and delicacies to sample immediately! The audience will find cheeses, sausages, jams, sweets, teas, and other delicacies. Heritage Food was created to be a bridge between the audience and small producers. The idea is to highlight authorial gastronomy, with narrative, handmade from generation to generation. In this scenario, the event seeks to give voice to the stories behind the products, connecting people through the food and flavors of different origins. In 2021, the curatorship is part of the Immigrant Festival in an unprecedented partnership.

Through a partnership with the Bunge Foundation, the Immigration Museum has a children's reading area called "Semear Leitores" (Sowing Readers). With low shelves making it easy to access the books, beanbags, and tatami, the area has elements linked to immigration, such as a train and a ship where the little ones can sit to read the publications available in the room. Storytelling, promoted by mediator Gabrielli Chagas, has limited vacancies (first come, first served).
